# SPANISH AND GALICIAN COURSES

The International Relations Office strongly recommends Erasmus students to take the FREE Spanish course the UDC offers at the beginning of the Winter and Spring Semester. Please note that the official languages of the University of A Coruña are Spanish and Galician, and the proper language of the UDC is Galician. Professors can teach their

classes in either of the two languages. Exchange students can also take Galician courses throughout the year at the University Language Center.

## REGISTRATION

The Erasmus students are required to register at the hternational Relations Office when they arrive in A Coruña, and bring with them the documents mentioned in the UDC Guide: <a href="http://www.udc.es/ori/cas/intercambio/guia\_ects/ECTSindex.shtml">http://www.udc.es/ori/cas/intercambio/guia\_ects/ECTSindex.shtml</a>
After their registration, students can apply for the official student card (free of charge). This card will enable students to have access to all university services (libraries, computer rooms, sports activities, cafeterias, etc). It can also be used as a credit card, if the student applies for it.

# ACCOMPANYING PROGRAMME

At the University of A Coruña, a fellow student is assigned to every international exchange student. This Spanish fellow student can help the new exchange students e. g. to find accommodation in the city, plan their study schedule and open a bank account. The contact information of the accompanying student is given to the exchange student when he comes to register at the International Relations Office, at their arrival in Coruña.

### CREDITS AND GRADING

One Spanish credit equals 10 teaching hours. The degrees of the "Licenciatura" and "Diplomatura" NOT ADAPTED to Bolonia, are being extinguished, and have Spanish credits. The new degrees of "Grado" and "Master" ADAPTED to Bolonia, have ECTS credits. There is no correlation between the Spanish credits and the ECTS credits.

## **GRADING SYSTEM**

A 10-tier grading scale (0-10) is used at the University of A Coruña, and it is compatible with the ECTS grading scale (A-E). We also use "No Presentado (N/P)" when the student register in one course but does not take the exam. This grade does not count in the student's total grading; it means the student did not take the course after all. # TRANSCRIPT OF RECORDS

The Transcript of Records of all the exchange students will be sent to the International Relations Office of the University of Origin, after the deadline the professors have to handle the grades in each faculty, and after the students have left the University of A Coruña. No grades will be sent to the University of Origin before the student has finished his/her study period.

### ACCOMODATION

The University of A Coruña does not have university residencies and it does not provide accommodation for Erasmus/Exchange students. There is a list of Hostels at the UDC Guide where the students can stay at their arrival in A Coruña. In the meantime they can look "in situ" for an apartment to share with other students.
