Being a student in DK

In Roskilde Handelsskole (Roskilde Business College) students have got very good studying conditions. There are available plenty of computers connected to the Internet, copies machines and laser printers (for free) allowing to print a lot of materials for



studies and for the projects. For more studying materials it is possible to use College library or Roskilde public library where students can borrow books from the libraries from whole Denmark. Moreover, I would like to add that almost every of the Danish students communicate easily in English. This is very important for international students. We feel comfortable, if we know that we can be understood by everybody. Danish teachers are very helpful in every situation and we treat them as our friends. What is important to add, is that education system in Denmark is a little bit different than in Poland. In Denmark we spent a lot of time on projects, which gives as opportunity to work in groups. This is amazing thing in study period. In this time we need to organize our work time efficiently, share responsibilities and work in order to achieve good results. This is very good experience which is valuable for a future career and future work. The classes are made as courses on which we have special groups and we are focus on special areas of interest. We gained deep knowledge about the study subjects. During the time in Denmark I attend in the evening, for a free Danish language course which is offered at Roskilde Language Centre. It is quite useful especially when somebody thinks about staying in Denmark for a longer period of time.

The best advantage to spent study period in Denmark is that we can meet here people from all over the world. We can speak in foreign languages and to become more flair with international culture and customs.
